

Bather and Groomer Assistant Program 5 Weeks - 200 hrs

1. Occupational Safety & Health -

- a. Safe use and maintenance of Petcare Hygienist equipment
 1. Brushes, combs
 2. Dematting tools, forceps
 3. Bathing tubs and equipment
 4. Cages and holding areas
 5. Hair dryers
 6. Pet styling tables
 7. Clippers and their blades
 8. Scissors and shears
- b. Perform emergency first aid in a normal Pet Styling Salon environment.
- c. Work safely and healthfully with Petcare DermaTech equipment within a normal salon environment
- d. Identify and avoid health risks which might occur during the styling process
- e. Be prepared for possible injuries that might occur during the styling process
- f. Be able to recognize symptoms and protect their environment from common zoonotic diseases

2. Canine/feline breed identification, characteristics, and coat types -

- a. Be able to identify common canine/feline breeds and their coat characteristics.

3. Canine/Feline Anatomy and Health -

- a. Under supervision, identify and avoid health risks which might occur during bathing and drying of dogs and cats.
- b. Be prepared for possible injuries that might occur during the bathing and drying of dogs and cats.
- c. Understanding of the canine/feline eyes, ears, nail and airways anatomy
- d. Safe and healthy handling of eyes, ears, nails, and airways while grooming, styling, and handling of dogs and cats.

4. Basic Animal behavior and Handling Techniques -

- a. Safe and effective management of canine/felines while in the salon and throughout their styling process

5. Common Canine/Feline Ectoparasites -

- a. Identification, life cycles and anatomy of common canine/feline fleas, ticks, mites and lice
- b. Understand the effects of commonly used insecticides and their effect on the environment, animals, and humans.
- c. Safely and effectively perform ectoparasite management on dogs and cats.

6. Insecticide selection and safe use -

- a. Understanding of common pesticides, their bio-chemical and environmental effects and classifications.
- b. Safe and healthy selection and application of pesticides.

7. Preparation Canines & Felines for Bath -

- a. Understanding and application of brushing, combing, and dematting techniques.
- b. Safe and healthy cleaning of canine and felines ears.
- c. Safe and healthy trimming of canine and feline nails.

8. Basic Canine/Feline Bathing Techniques

- a. Understanding and application of directional bathing techniques
- b. Mixture and application of shampoos, conditioners, oils.

9. Topical Conditioning of Canine/Feline Skin and Hair -

- a. Understand the anatomy of canine/feline skin and hair
- b. Understand and apply the principles of topical conditioning of canine/feline skin and hair
- c. Safe, healthy, and effective topical maintenance and conditioning of dog and cat hair.
- d. Safe and effective coloring of dog and cat hair.

10. Finishing Techniques -
